- Students perform Green School Audits
- Generate recommendations for improvement
- Present recommendations to a "blue ribbon" panel on April 18<sup>th</sup> at The MET High School
  - Short written document explaining process and final recommendation
  - "Science Fair" style event
- \$5 million of reallocated bond funds support chosen projects
- Project executions to start during the Summer of 2012



### Major Initiatives

- Implementation of student Project Green recommendations
- Expand a comprehensive recycling program
- Partner with local organization to analyze indoor air quality in classrooms across the District
- Expand outdoor education by increasing the number of school gardens and e 142bDng choycrarag aes
