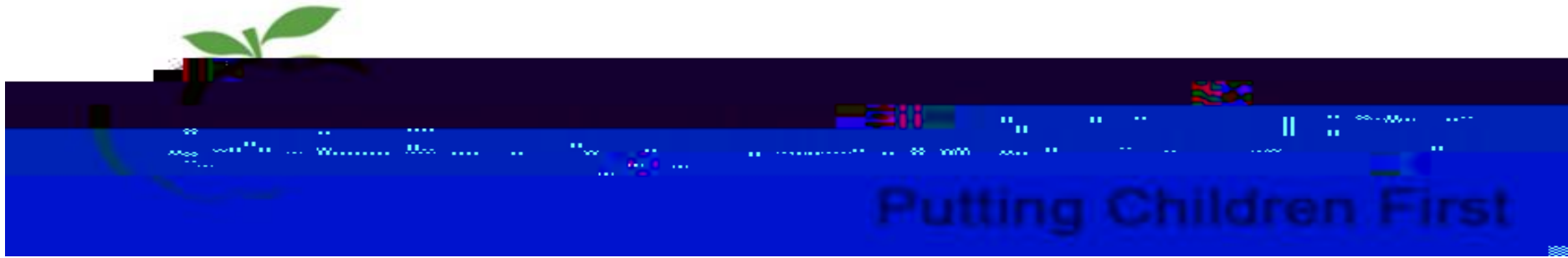

AAAB Purpose

1. To **advise** the Board and Superintendent and relevant District Department designee(s) regarding accountability of **services, programs, policies and resources** that **directly impact** the district/school culture and climate of our classrooms and the **academic, social/emotional and personal outcomes** for B/AA students.
1. To **review, monitor, and evaluate** the continuous improvement of the district's **implementation** of the Board adopted B/AA Task Force recommendations as of May 16, 2019, and consider other possible strategic areas as appropriate.

MOST LIKELY TO:

- Be suspended or expelled;
- Be identified for special education

LEAST LIKELY TO:

- Become proficient readers by third grade;
- Be placed in Gifted and Talented Educational programs;
- Master the mid-level mathematics skills that position students for success in college-preparatory math courses;
- Be placed in a full sequence of college-preparatory courses;
- Complete an Advancement Placement (AP) Course;
- Meet the the A-G College Readiness UC/CSU Eligibility Requirements
